Collaborating partner organizations are working towards an operational toolkit based on the Gender-Transformative Framework for Nutrition (GTFN). In close collaboration with the project team, the goal of your responsibilities would be to provide research support for the operationalization of the GTFN that integrates inclusivity, diversity and equity. Your responsibilities will include the following categories:

1) Summary of best practices of participatory approaches and tools

- Contribute to the development of a compendium of all existing tools and resources per GTFN domain, area and region;
- Review existing tools and resources in terms of usefulness across contexts in a participatory manner with the collaborating partner organizations, the Steering Committee and other relevant stakeholders;
- Explore the relevancy of building a scoping review based on the summary of best practices;
- Prepare an estimated schedule for the systematic review;
- Capture lessons learned of the process to build the compendium.

2) Stakeholder Analysis Exercise

- Support the identification of relevant stakeholders and Steering Committee members based on an established governance structure;
- Capture lessons learned of the exercise.

3) Representation and Coordination

- Attend regular meetings (by virtual platforms) with Technical Staff;
- Prepare meeting minutes for research team.

 Studies/Epidemiology/Nutrition or a combination of relevant training and work experience;
- Strong verbal and written communication skills including demonstration of cultural awareness, diplomacy and tact;

- Demonstrated experience in qualitative and quantitative research methods;
